Human Impact Partners seeks a Health Equity Capacity Building Intern for the summer of 2022 to help advance a transformative health equity practice with an understanding that structural racism, other forms of oppression, and power imbalances are the root of health inequities.

Start date: Summer 2022 (flexible start and end dates to align with summer availability)

Time commitment: Full-time, for approximately 3 months

Hourly rate: \$22-\$26/hour DOE

Location: Remote - must be a resident of CA, CO, FL, or WI. We expect to resume in-office operations sometime in 2022; once that happens, working from our Oakland, CA office will be an option for Bay Area-based interns.

We believe that sustainable, long-term change to improve social, economic, and political conditions comes about through organized social movements, and by explicitly challenging unjust power imbalances and systems of advantage and oppression. With racial inequities and power inequality at unprecedented levels, public health must be deeply engaged in larger social justice movements to achieve health for all. About the Position

HIP is looking for a graduate-level student who is interested in learning about ways to advance health equity within governmental public health practice. We are looking for someone who is excited to research best practices to support organizational change and innovation in the service of addressing unjust power imbalances and systems of advantage and oppression.

The Health Equity Capacity Building intern will report to HIP's Health Equity Awakened Project Director, working with them and other HIP staff. They will support work being led by the <u>Health Equity Capacity Building Program</u>. Tasks and projects may include:

- Providing online research support to create checklists, fact sheets, work sheets, slide decks, and other health equity training and technical assistance materials to support institutional change
- Helping to coordinate the delivery of our training offerings with local health departments
- Working alongside the Leadership Institute Project Director to provide logistical support for HIP's <u>Health Equity Awakened Leadership Institute</u>.
- Updating the Health Equity Capacity Building resource library with readings, videos, audio clips, and tools to support individual, team, and institutional change to advance racial justice
